History

The third generation of the BMW 5 Series (E34) was officially presented to the press in January 1988. BMW Motorsport GmbH also launched the BMW M5 high-performance saloon on the market generating an impressive 315 hp in 1988. The high-revving 6-cylinder engine developed a maximum torque of 360 Nm at 4750 rpm at first and accelerated the saloon weighing 1,717 kg to 100 km/h within just 6.3 seconds. From 1992, the engine even generated as much as 340 hp, making the BMW M5 the most powerful German series saloon.
